Newest Members of the Cougar Hall of Fame Announced

Alan attended Sahuaro from 1984 - 1988 where he was an outstanding student and athlete. Alan scored a perfect score on his SAT test which helped him on his application for the Naval Academy. He was sponsored by Senator John McCain and excelled at the Naval Academy in baseball and his studies.

Captain Schrader has commanded several nuclear submarines during his time with the Navy, and also has served as a Naval ROTC instructor. He is currently the Commanding Officer of Naval BASE Kitsap in the State of Washington, where he oversees 3600 personnel.

He has personally earned many awards but is most proud of three Battle E awards for excellence for his submarines.

In 2017 Captain Schrader earned the Commander in Chief Award, which "recognizes the outstanding and innovative efforts of the people who operate and maintain U.S. military installations. The five recipients of this highly competitive presidential award were selected for their exemplary support of Department of Defense missions."

Alan currently resides in the State of Washington with his wife and two sons.



Ed attended Sahuaro from 1969 - 1973 where he was an outstanding wrestler and student. He was undefeated in wrestling 3 of his 4 years, winning 96% of all his high school matches.

Ed attended Eastern Illinois University on a wrestling scholarship where he was a 2-time All American and an NCAA champion.

Ed's wrestling accomplishments helped him to earn a scholarship to the University of Arizona where he wrestled in the first wrestling match held in McKale Center.

Ed earned his Masters and Doctorate Degrees from the University of Arizona. Dr. Torrejon was the principal of Homer Davis elementary school until he retired in 1992.

After his retirement Ed became the director of the 6th Street Gym here in Tucson, which along with the nonprofit Foundation Youth Ministries focuses on at-risk youth and other members of the community who need the assistance of a support system.

Ed is always looking for ways to help the youth of Tucson. Ed currently resides in Tucson.

Founder's Corner - Notes from Dr. David Ashcraft In appreciation of those who led the way for Sahuaro High

The term "town and gown" is utilized by colleges and universities to describe the acquisition of faculty who are graduates of the particular institution.

In some higher education cultures, such customs are discouraged due to the notion that outside influence and expertise is more healthy and desirable. Yet, many more familial, or close-knit institutions encourage such hiring, and actually seek out their own.

Sahuaro has long embraced the practice of welcoming returning graduates to the faculty and staff. The first two returning alums were **David Ashcraft** and **Carol Orcutt Holly**, both graduates of the inaugural Class of 1970 who arrived back at Sahuaro together in 1974.

Carol most likely retains the distinction of being the longest tenured faculty member in school history, far eclipsing David's 33-year ride. Carol has been said by many to be "the glue that has held the school together" or "the gift that keeps on giving." Well-known for her distinctive work in the Exceptional Education Department, Carol was among the first on campus to become expert in all things Mac in the mid-eighties and beyond. She also has, along with Harry Johnson, served as an invaluable historian, creating a multitude of photo collages that have graced various class reunions, as well as the annual Cougar Foundation Breakfast.

Carol has maintained a database of grads, and has coordinated the publication of several commemorative school directories. It is no surprise that she was inducted into the Cougar Foundation Hall of Fame in 1998. Her legacy lives on through the three Sahuaro grads currently serving in the Exceptional Education Department.

Other alums have returned and subsequently left the faculty in the past few years. In pondering the current state of Sahuaro alums on campus, yours truly identified six individuals that immediately came to mind.

After reaching out (with Paula Saldutti's assistance) five more proudly came forward for a total of eleven former Cougars.

The Classes of 1986 and 2000 lead the way with three Sahuaro grads each. The Classes of 1981, 1993, 1998, 2008 and 2010 each boast one graduate.

The list includes, among others: Activities Director; four head coaches (Baseball, Boys Basketball; Girls Golf; Boys Volleyball; Yearbook Advisor; Drama Teacher; English Department Chair; Exceptional Education Department Chair; Foreign Languages Department Chair; and, a Guidance Counselor.

I am proud of the noble work accomplished by these individuals and the contributions they have made to the Sahuaro community. Cougars lead the way!
