Inaugural Class of 1970 to hold its 50-year reunion this summer

Another Sahuaro first will be celebrated this summer as the inaugural Class of 1970 convenes for its 50th Reunion, the first such event in the school's history. The members of the first graduating class hold the unique distinction of having enjoyed "senior" status two years in a row. Sahuaro opened its doors in the fall of 1968 with just three classes, i.e. 9th, 10th and 11th grades.

As described by Carol Orcutt Holly, this "once in a lifetime event" will take place on August 28-29 at the Desert Diamond Hotel and Casino on Tucson's west side. Friday night will be a casual mixer, and Saturday evening will feature a resort casual barbecue with a DJ. A block of rooms will be reserved for those who desire lodging.

Class members are encouraged to visit the Class of 1970 website at sahuaro70.com and to spread the word about the reunion. Updates will be published as they occur.

All Sahuaro alumni are encouraged to check on reunion information and schedules by logging onto the Cougar Foundation website at sahuarocougars.org.

The 1994 Champion Football Squad Honored at the 4A Championship

Last month at the halftime of the Championship battle between Desert Edge and Mesquite, the Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA) honored coaches and players of the team which earned the title 25 years ago.

Honored for coaching that team was Cougar Hall of Fame Member and prolific football coach **Howard Breinig** (who would retire after the season). In addition to Breinig, former, assistants **Nemer Hassey** and **Will Kreamer** were honored.

The 1994 team included some exceptional talent, including Omar Bacon, Aaron Dumsch, Tony Lucas, Ricky Solis and Nate Goerke.

Unfortunately, not all Cougars from that team are with us today. **Tony Sauceda** died in August of liver disease. His 1994 teammate, **Matt Louzensky**, had a commemorative football signed by dozens of Cougars; the ball was presented to Sauceda's son, Hayden, at the game.

Steve Botkin a 'Coach of the Decade', per Daily Star Columnist Greg Hansen

In his annual write-up of Tucson coaching excellence, columnist Greg Hansen had glowing things to say about Sahuaro Cougar Foundation Board Member and the school's Activities Director Steve Botkin.

Says Hansen: "Under Botkin, the Cougars went 218-67 in the decade, the most victories by any high school basketball coach, boys or girls, in Tucson. Sahuaro reached the state semifinals in 2015, 2018 and 2019 and have opened this season 8-0. No girls basketball team in Tucson, any level, won a state basketball championship in the decade."

Cougar Foundation Purchases 22 Graphing Calculators for the Math Department

The Cougar Foundation Board of Directors voted unanimously to approve an expenditure for 22 graphing calculators. These calculators were gifted to the school's math department and are going to be used by Algebra 2 students who may not be in a position to otherwise purchase such expensive technology. Supporting the education of current Cougars is one of the most fundamental priorities for the Foundation.

Math teacher **Amanda Goodenow** made the request of the board, stating, "these [calculators] allow students to expand on the basic curriculum and include more data analysis and use that saved time to connect their research to real-world analysis".

Girls Basketball Team off to a hot start. leader Alvssa Brown honored

The #1-ranked (at the time of publication) Girls Basketball Team is off to a great start. At 14-0 overall and 6-0 in conference play, the Cougars hosted the Boyd Baker Tip-Off Classic over Thanksgiving break and saw great success:

The Cougars defeated Empire 64-32, Sunnyside 70-54, Catalina Foothills 54-30 in the semifinals and Salpointe Catholic 59-52 in the Championship game.

Additionally, the team saw success in the Flowing Wells Holiday Shootout, played over the holiday break, December 27-28.

They defeated Yuma Kofa, Rincon/University High, Georgetown (Austin, Texas) in the semi-fi-



nals 60-58 and Sierra Vista Buena 57-45 in the Championship game of the Flowing Wells Holiday Shootout.

Leading the team is Junior Alyssa Brown, who is averaging over 30 points per game and recently broke the school-high career scoring record of former Cougar **Sydney Harden**. (Did we mention that Harden is Brown's older sister and an Assistant Coach for the team?

Tucson Parks Named Posthumously for Former Cougar Standouts

Despite renovation at the Lincoln Park Softball Fields, Cougar Hall of Fame Inductee **Julie Reitan** now has her name on the newest set of softball fields at Lincoln Park. Though the four original fields were named after her in an effort to honor the late Sahuaro softball champion and University of Arizona standout softball player, the new fields were nameless until last year when the City Council voted to expand the name to the new fields as well.

Reitan was only 21 years old and a member of the World Champion Wildcat Softball team when she died in 1997 due to complications from diabetes.

Reitan is not the only Cougar who has been honored with a park naming. Army Sgt. 1st Class **Todd M. Harris**, who graduated from Sahuaro in 1992, died in 2010 in Afghanistan after his unit was hit by small-arms fire.



A former football standout at Sahuaro, the special forces soldier was a member of the 1st Battalion, 87th Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat team, part of the 10th Mountain Division based at Fort Drum, N.Y.

The effort to rename Golf Links Park on the northwest corner of Golf Links and Craycroft Roads was spearheaded by friends and survivors of Harris, who joined the armed forces in 1998. The park was officially renamed in July of 2019.
